Knights fall to Pigs 6-3

Game starter John Parke went five innings, allowing three runs on seven hits. He made no contribution to the choice. Just two runs were allowed over the remaining five innings by the Charlotte bullpen, which pitched well that evening. Finnegan gave Charlotte the victory in the contest.

After a hard fight against the Jumbo Shrimp, the Knights were trailing 5-4 after Brandon Finnegan gave up a run on a wild pitch in the top of the 10th inning. Shrimp was up 5-4 and the Knights had to battle back in order to win.

Jumbo Shrimp right hand pitcher Jeff Brigham fell to the pressure allowing the Knights to score. Brigham allowed the game-winning runs to score after Yolbert Sánchez hit a ball between the legs of Jacksonville second baseman Bryson Brigman, who was penalized with an error, after walking the first two batters to load the bases.

The last two runs of the game were scored by center fielder Adam Haseley and pinch-runner Laz Rivera, giving the Knights a dramatic walk-off victory.
